A Message from Council President Tony Saban

I'm beginning my fourth consecutive 3-year term as a member of the governing body of the Borough of Clayton, and have been Council President since 2012. For 2020, I am Council Liaison for Public Works, and also serve on the Veterans Affairs, Historic Advisory, School Affairs, and Park and Recreation Committees. I have been employed by Subaru of America at our company's headquarters in Camden for almost 30 years. I began my career as a technician, and my current role is Supervisor of the Technical Helpline, supervising a group of between 10-14 other technical representatives. My wife Barbara and I have been residents for over 22 years, and we truly enjoy living here. I am committed to public service as it gives me an opportunity to help fellow residents and to be involved with projects and activities that benefit our community. I've also served with the fire department holding both company and departmental positions. In my spare time, I enjoy being with my wife and son John. What I hope to accomplish this year is to improve our Public Works equipment to enable our DPW team to more efficiently and effectively complete the myriad of tasks required of them, and also to continue to explore servicing areas that do not presently have public water and sewer. In addition, I want to continue to ensure that the borough's water supply meets or exceeds the standards established by the state and federal governments.



A Message from Mayor Tom Bianco

As we begin 2020, I would like to outline some of the goals we have for the Borough. First, we will focus on continuing development and redevelopment in Clayton, adding to the business growth we've had in the last few years with the repurposing of businesses that were eye sores to the community which now generate taxes and provide job opportunities for residents and others. We also will continue applying for and utilizing grant funding to make infrastructure improvements and to offset costs to the residents. This year, the Borough received grants from: the NJ Department of Transportation (\$270,000) to make roadway improvements on South Broad Street; the NJ State Body Armor Replacement Fund (\$1,759) for vests for our police officers; Municipal Alliance (\$12,000) for alcohol and drug awareness programs; a Recycling Tonnage Grant through the state's Recycling Enhancement Act (\$8,739) for recycling programs; and a Community Development Block Grant award (\$50,000) for Green St. road upgrades. Finally, we will continue to explore ways to reduce the tax burden to residents without sacrificing services.

Tire Amnesty Month!

The GCIA/Office of Recycling, in cooperation with the Gloucester County Board of Chosen Freeholders, is pleased to announce they will conduct another "Tire Amnesty Month" in March 2020. All Gloucester County residents and municipalities (no commercial business allowed) may drop off used tires at the County Solid Waste Complex located at 493 Monroeville Road in South Harrison Township during these times; Monday – Friday: 8:30 am to 3:00 pm, March 1st through March 29th. The facility will also be open on Saturday, March 16th from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm. It is important to remove old tires as they collect water and become breeding grounds for disease carrying mosquitos. Please take advantage of this important program which protects the waste stream and the environment.

Stormwater Collection

How does all that curbside debris find its way to the local creek or lake? When it rains, stormwater carries debris along the roadway to a nearby storm drain. The stormwater not only carries debris such as litter, but also less visible pollutants such as oil and antifreeze from cars, pesticides from lawns and even metals from brake linings. The storm drain leads to a system of stormwater collection pipes that lie beneath the streets. These underground pipes carry the stormwater directly into waterways. The best way to avoid contaminating local waterways is pollution prevention. By preventing pollution sources from coming in contact with stormwater, the stormwater remains clean and does not cause water quality problems when it enters the waterways. Salem Oak Seedlings!

In November 2019, NJ DEP Commissioner Catherine R. McCabe announced that each municipality in New Jersey would receive a Salem Oak seedling from the historic Salem Oak tree. The Salem Oak was an historic tree in Salem County that had been celebrated as an icon for over 100 years, being commemorated on postcards, plates, and other items. The tree, a white oak, was estimated to be between 500-600 years old and was on property belonging to the Religious Society of Friends. Tragically, the tree uprooted and fell over on June 6, 2019. In an effort to perpetuate the legacy of the great tree, the NJ DEP is sending each NJ municipality a seedling from it. Clayton will be receiving its seedling sometime in April in conjunction with Arbor Day. With guidance from the Clayton Environmental Commission, Public Works will plant the seedling in a location where it will flourish for many years to come.
