The New Jersey Department of Transportation's Commitment to Communities Initiative helps local governments succeed in delivering transportation projects. In line with this initiative, I am pleased to inform you that Clayton Borough has been selected to receive \$632,000.00 from the Safe Routes to School Program for the NJDOT Safe Routes to Schools Program FY2022 Project.

The Safe Routes to School Program is administered by the New Jersey Department of Transportation in partnership with the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA), the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC), and the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization (SJTPO). The Department along with NJTPA, DVRPC, and SJTPO recognize the overwhelming needs of communities throughout the state and their desire to improve the health of children by promoting walking and bicycling to school. As with all federally funded programs, the funds will be dispersed on a reimbursement basis.

Please note that School Travel Tallies are being requested and are required as part of this grant. Information on conducting and submitting the tallies is located at: www.saferoutesnj.org. All tallies must be submitted by no later than July 15, 2022.

The award of Safe Routes to School grants will be contingent upon the recipient's ability to comply with all applicable federal financial management, project implementation, and oversight regulations. grant recipient's capabilities comply with state and federal requirements for the administration of federal-aid highway grants including 23 CFR-Highways, and OMB requirements related to 2 CFR 200, 2 CFR 215, audit requirements will be assessed prior to awarding of funding for this project.

Additionally, all recipients of federal and state grants are required to comply with the provisions of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
