# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT Between

### BOROUGH OF CLAYTON

#### and

### FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE LODGE NO. 130

WHEREAS, Robert Martines has indicated an intent to retire from the Clayton Police Department on May 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Officer Martines has accrued compensatory time remaining; and

WHEREAS, Article XI of the Collective Negotiations Agreement Between the Borough of Clayton and the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 130 (Patrol Officers) provides, "When an employee retires, he/she will be paid all compensatory time on a bi-weekly basis at the employee's current rate of pay"; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and the FOP have conferred regarding how to treat the disposition of the unused compensatory time of Officer Martines; and

WHEREAS, the parties seek to avoid grievance proceedings or other litigation regarding the unique issues raised in these circumstances:

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

- In light of the intent of Officer Martines to retire on May 1, 2022, the remaining compensatory time for Officer Martines shall by paid by April 22, 2022.
- Nothing in this Memorandum of Agreement shall constitute a past practice or precedent of any kind. Nothing in this Memorandum of Agreement shall bind either the Borough or the FOP in future situations.
